Reading:

Nonfiction Reading Unit
During this unit, children will learn about
nonfiction text features such as
photographs, captions, headings, bold
words, glossary, index, and labels. We will
compare and contrast nonfiction and
fiction books to see how they are alike
and different.



Writing:

In March, we wrote realistic fiction stories. We learned that when writers write realistic fiction, they take stories that *could* happen and embellish them by adding untrue, interesting details.

In April, we will begin our information writing unit. All the hard work we've done in our nonfiction reading unit will come in handy!

Social Studies

We will begin our last social studies unit on Hartland History. During this unit, we will learn what Hartland was like when the first settlers arrived in our "small town". In June, we look forward to taking a walking field trip to visit some of the places we will learn about such as the Cromaine Library, the Music Hall, and the Florence B. Dearing Museum. Reading chapter books at home



Many kids form a bond with the main character in a chapter book and continue the series in order to go on more adventures with that character. Even if your child is unable to read the books independently, reading a chapter book with your child can be a fun way to spend time together. When parents read aloud to children, they model reading fluently and with expression. Parents can ask comprehension questions as they read such as "What do you think the author meant by that?" Some kids like to follow along in their own copy of the book while the parent reads, so finding 2 copies might be a good idea. No matter which way works best for you and your child, reading regularly is so important. Check out some chapter book series suggestions below.

Math:

In April, kids will finish up our money unit and start telling time. In our money unit, kids are learning to count money, write money, make change, and solve money word problems.

In our telling time unit, kids will learn to tell time to the nearest five minutes, tell time using "fancy" vocabulary (i.e. quarter past, half past, quarter til), and solve math problems using elapsed time concepts.

To help your child at home, you can reinforce these important concepts in real-life situations. When paying at the store, talk to your child about making change. When getting ready for school in the morning, talk to your child about what time it currently is, and what time s/he must leave for the bus. Help your child determine how many minutes (elapsed time) s/he has to finish getting ready. Putting math skills to use in real-life situations will help your child's learning to STICK! ©
